Enviro News:

Officials at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment have decided to revoke a radioactive materials license for Piñon Ridge uranium mill near Naturita. The company was proposing to build a mill to process uranium from local mines in western Colorado at an estimated cost of \$120 million. The proposed mill would process 500 tons a day of uranium and vanadium ore from mines in western Colorado.
