Enviro News:

Chemicals Undergoing Prioritization under TSCA

On March 20, 2019, EPA issued a list of 40 chemicals to begin the prioritization process as required under section 6(b) of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA). EPA designated 20 chemicals as "high-priority" for subsequent risk evaluation and to designate 20 chemicals as "low-priority," meaning that risk evaluation is not warranted at this time.
